Lorenze graduated from Tech High in 1956 and served in the U.S. Army from 1961-1963. Janice graduated from Louisville High School in 1960. They were married in 1962 and lived in Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri, where Lorenze was stationed. Upon completion of military service, Lorenze and Janice returned to Louisville where Lorenze began working in the underground utility construction business. In 1975, Lorenze and Janice founded L.G. Roloff Construction Co., Inc., a firm specializing in the installation and repair of sanitary sewers, storm sewers, water mains, and concrete roadways. The company now employs 70, many of whom are residents of Sarpy and Cass counties.

Throughout their lives, Lorenze and Janice have dedicated significant personal time and energy to public service. The work of their company has improved and/or enhanced the quality of life for many residents of Sarpy, Cass and Douglas counties by ensuring that clean water and proper sanitation is provided for area residents. Their projects have enabled growth and economic development in the area.

He has served on the Louisville Public School Board and has been involved in many leadership roles at Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church of rural Louisville. She spent several years as a 4-H Club leader and a member of the Cass County Extension Club in Louisville and has volunteered for the Cass County Fair, Cattleman's Ball and the University Hospital Auxiliary. Janice is also a member of the Louisville American Legion Post #353 Auxiliary.
